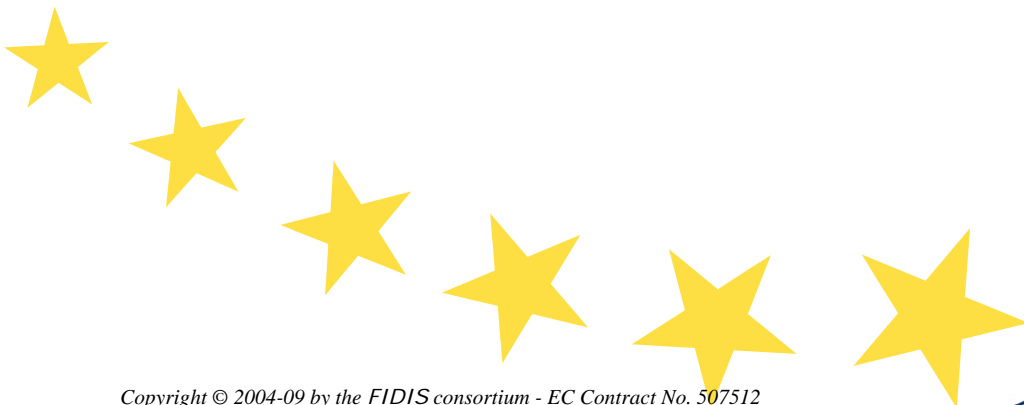
Future of Identity in the Information Society

Please find below a short wrap-up of Thursday's D11.12 working session in order to keep everybody up to date with the newest developments and tasks.

Having seen the first compiled version of all contributions, we agreed on a new structure as well as a new title of the deliverable.

The new title of FIDIS D11.12 will be "**Mobile Marketing in the Perspective of Identity, Privacy and Transparency**". This was done to better reflect the scope of the single contributions within the deliverable.

In addition to that, we agreed on restructuring the deliverable as follows:

The deliverable will be split in two thematic clusters. Those are:

- Technical & Economic Aspects of Identity, Privacy, and Transparency (by Sandra & Mike)
- Legal Aspects of Identity, Privacy, and Transparency (by Fanny, Niels, Harald), working title: "Legal safeguards fore transparency & informed consent"

Binding element between the two clusters will be the discussion of "Transparency" in the context of using customer information for mobile marketing purposes.
